

VISA AND VACCINATION

- For countries that require a visa to enter Malaysia, you must apply for eVISA before departing.
 - Upload the necessary travel documents through the system.
 - Ensure that all documents are scanned clearly for the smooth process of approval.
 - eVISA fees and related costs are to be borne by the participants.

 - Bring along the eVISA and all the necessary travel documents for the arrival in Malaysia.
- For countries that do not require a visa to enter Malaysia, may enter with Social Visit Pass.

 - Required to take mandatory vaccination for Yellow Fever at least ten (10) days prior to their departure to Malaysia. Yellow Fever Vaccination certificate is required upon landing in Malaysia.

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was initiated at the First Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) for Asia Pacific Region held in Sydney in February 1978. It was officially launched on 7th September 1980 at the 2nd CHOGRM in New Delhi, India to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC). The MTCP emphasises the development of human resources through the provision of training in various areas which is essential for a country's development. These areas include diplomacy and diplomatic practices, economy, good governance, education, tourism, environment, social development, halal industry, safety and security as well as technology, among others. COURSE METHODOLOGY

The training will be conducted through a combination of presentations, interactive discussions, group activities, case studies, and site visits to ensure practical and engaging learning.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Strengthen understanding of the IMO 2023 Greenhouse Gases (GHG) Strategy and its linkages to the Paris Agreement framework
- Translate international climate-shipping commitments into national maritime policy, legal and institutional frameworks
- Introduce instruments for port-level decarbonisation, measurement, reporting and verification (MRV) compliance as well as environmental security risk mitigation
- Build literacy on financing and implementation pathways including Article 6 of the Paris Agreement's cooperation, climate funds and blended finance
- Develop national maritime decarbonisation action plans incorporating port operational and environmental security considerations

APPLICATION AND ENQUIRIES

- Only complete applications that are made through the MTCP website at <https://mtcp.kln.gov.my/courses2/list2> will be considered. Select the course name and click "Apply Course" to generate a new application form.
- Applicants are required to complete the online application form, upload a passport sized photo, and provide a self-introduction video. A draft link will be sent via email and must be accessed using a One-Time Password (OTP) and submitted within seven (7) days. The manual for the application process can be found on the MTCP Website.
- All application forms must be duly completed and endorsed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of candidates' respective countries and should be submitted only through the diplomatic channel via Malaysian Embassy/ High Commission of Malaysia.
- Successful candidates will be duly notified by MIMA one (1) month before the commencement of the course.
- Incomplete and/or unendorsed forms will not be considered.

PARTICIPANTS WILL RECEIVE SUPPORT FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF MALAYSIA:

Accommodation

- Participants will be accommodated at a hotel / hostel within the vicinity of the training institute. Participants are strictly not allowed to bring any family members during the course.

Daily Allowance

- Participants will be provided with daily allowance.

Meals

- Meals will be provided throughout the duration of the course.

Air Fares

- A return flight ticket from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on economy class is provided for participants.

Course

- All course fees are borne by the Government of Malaysia.
